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THE AMERICAN THEATRE WING RECEIVES NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS GRANT

GRANT TO SUPPORT CAREER DEVELOPMENT FOR TOMORROW'S THEATRE ARTISTS AND INDUSTRY LEADERS

GRANT IS ONE OF 886 NEA ART WORKS GRANTS TOTALING \$25.8 MILLION IN FUNDING NATIONWIDE

New York, NY (April 16, 2014) — **National Endowment for the Arts** (NEA) Acting Chairman Joan Shigekawa announced today that the American Theatre Wing is one of 886 nonprofit organizations nationwide to receive an **NEA Art Works grant**. The American Theatre Wing is recommended for a \$20,000 grant to support their SpringboardNYC and Theatre Intern Group programs.

SpringboardNYC prepares promising college acting students for a dynamic career in theatre through a two-week "boot camp" taught by prominent members of New York City's theatrical community. Since its inception in 2005, SpringboardNYC has helped launch the careers of a diverse group of over 350 young professionals, 90% of whom are still working in the industry. The **Theatre Intern Group** provides professional development opportunities for young people beginning careers in commercial and nonprofit theatre offices. Monthly panel discussions examine the varied facets of the theatre industry, offering insight into theatre management, finances, marketing and promotion, producing, and more. Theatre Intern Group serves more than 150 interns per year, distributes over 1,200 free theatre tickets annually, and helps over 1,000 alumni maintain a network with their peers.

NEA Acting Chairman Shigekawa said, "The NEA is pleased to announce that the American Theatre Wing is recommended for an NEA Art Works grant. These NEA-supported projects will not only have a positive impact on local economies, but will also provide opportunities for people of all ages to participate in the arts, help our communities to become more vibrant, and support our nation's artists as they contribute to our cultural landscape."

American Theatre Wing Executive Director **Heather A. Hitchens** said, "Through these programs, we bring together a diverse group of aspiring young stage actors and theatre industry leaders from across the country, connect them with extraordinary mentors and a network of peers, and prepare them for leading roles onstage and behind the scenes. We are delighted that the NEA has once again joined in our commitment to develop the next generation of theatre professionals."

Art Works grants support the creation of art that meets the highest standards of excellence, public engagement with diverse and excellent art, lifelong learning in the arts, and enhancement of the livability of communities through the arts. The NEA received 1,515 eligible applications under the Art Works category, requesting more than \$76 million in funding. Of those applications, 886 are recommended for grants for a total of \$25.8 million.

The Wing develops the next generation of theatre professionals through the SpringboardNYC and Theatre Intern Group programs, incubates innovative theatre across the country through the National Theatre Company Grants, fosters the song of American theatre through the Jonathan Larson Grants, and illuminates the creative process through the "Working in the Theatre" program and media archive.
