William Ivey Long is a five-time Tony® Award-winning costume designer. He recently designed Don't Dress For Dinner, for which he received his twelfth Tony® nomination. Other credits include Chicago, now in its 16th year, Hugh Jackman: Back On Broadway, Pal Joey, Curtains; Grey Gardens, The Frogs, The Boy From Oz, Hairspray, The Producers, The Music Man, Contact, Cabaret, Steel Pier, Smokey Joe's Café, Madison Square Garden's A Christmas Carol, Guys And Dolls, Crazy For You, Six Degrees Of Separation, Lend Me A Tenor, Nine. William received a BA in history from The College of William and Mary, was a Kress Fellow in Art History at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and received an MFA in stage design from the Yale School of Drama. He joined United Scenic Artists in 1974, and

designed his first Broadway show, *The Inspector General*, in 1978. During a career that spans 38 years and 63 Broadway productions, he has won four Hewes Awards, five Drama Desk Awards, and four Outer Critics Circle Awards. He was inducted into the Theatre Hall of Fame in January 2006.

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
